
THE PROJECT:

Rashesh Shah and Company had an existing company in the old city of Surat, therefore to expand their company they selected an office in the very new and developing area of Surat. It is a family run practice and is a well known firm for Chartered Accountants and tribunal practices. They wanted to have a new premise that was not a stale corporate- model but it shall reflect that it is run by a family and is not a corporate office. The client had an ideology of an informal workspace and that needed to be reflected. He had a very clear vision about how casual the office environment needs to be, he wanted to bring in a new culture in the entire workplace.



THE SITE:

The site is located in a new area of the city of Surat, in order to have a good connectivity for everyone to have an easy access. The site is on the 4th Floor of the Titaanium Business Hub, Althan road with a carpet area of 4400 sq. ft.





DESIGN THROUGH DETAILS

The entire concept of this office resulted from the minute details that were designed according to the theme and the color palette borrowed from the traditional motif- be it the blue threads on the light fixtures or the motif imprinted door handles to continue the idea or the numbers allotted to each working desk with a stationery holder or the fabric light fixtures to give a softer yet elegant look to the spaces. It was an obvious choice to use tiles and laminates due to the budget, so the richness was brought in by these small gestures.



The imprints of the motif can also be seen, carved on the shutters of the cupboard and the colors from the same are borrowed and painted on the edges of the working desks to create a harmonious environment inside.



Being a slightly tight- budget project, the challenge was to make the office look opulent and totally impressive but still fit into the budget. Therefore, the material palette was kept simple in terms of vitrified tiles on the floor and the furniture is fabricated and custom designed, it was either painted or covered with laminates. Also the tiles are three small tiles used to create a bigger tile that was laser cut to make each tile block into a beautiful pattern. The project consisted of the interesting details that we got by innovating a lot while making things on site.
