### THE PROJECT:

The Humble House rightly belongs to a tremendously down to earth family with a fair inclination towards Art and Philosophy. They were very well connected to the value system and the architectural simplicity brushes on to the interiors of the project. The architectural challenge was how to not make it look like an apartment block as we had to go ground plus three floors to fulfil the client's wish, in a small plot.

#### THE SITE:

Located in a quiet residential society in the outskirts of Surat, the 5200 sq feet modern bungalow was designed by us on this 400 sq yard plot located on the corner of three road junction of the society.





## THE MINIMAL AND MODEST!

The house is about the value system that predominantly comes out of the urge of the client to do a very simple and humble house which is not trying to stand out. The whole endeavor was to create spaces that reflect minimal and modest ideology that the client inherits and follows.





So what was attempted here was dividing floors into different materials and slightly shifting floor plates. So with that we tried to achieve this and it was basically four floors each stacked on each other with a little shift and there was an enclosure made through this concrete shell. The architectural endeavor in terms of form was that in a concrete shell, four smaller boxes are kept.




THE SOUTH- EAST FACADE




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




Paradoxically to the client's aspiration of a very simple house, we strived to the designer's satisfaction by using the most basic material palette of Kotah Stone, Form finished Concrete, White Paint, Polished Teak Wood, Granite, Glass and Aluminium, to design certain parts of the house, that were very well detailed and used the material properties of the respective materials well. All the bathrooms of the house uses just one stone, the Kotah Stone in all its avatars like polished, river washed, rough, butched and grooved. This creates spaces that are soothing to eye and very functional.









Beyond the basic material palette, throughout this house, there is one element which really unites the house and sends out a clear message of simplicity that the client aspired for. All the light fixtures of the house are fabricated elements having holders for open led bulbs and they work very well in all the spaces by filling the spaces with light rather than creating any sort of drama.

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The Spiral of Life was an idea playing on the minds of the client at a philosophical level, and we made an attempt to materialize it through the art, furniture and the lighting of the living room. Whenever a person visits the house for the first time, he easily notices the connection and cannot resist from asking the client the connection between the spirals, and the client is always beaming as he explains the ideology through!

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








So a niche designed with a skylight was selected for the purpose. A large painting of MKG on the bare concrete wall with a simple seating with jute tapestry became his place for meditation and thinking. The feedback is that it really works well for the purpose.







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
